In October 2019, fires started burning across three States and by New Year's Day had extended south to beachside holiday towns. The immense scale of the fires and the images and stories coming out of these communities were so significant that coverage extended beyond Australia and had an impact on international audiences. Just as these communities started the long process of recovery and rebuilding, a global pandemic reached our shores and COVID-19 became the headline news.

In what have been uncertain times with businesses closed and people in self-isolation, we want to assure you that our work hasn't stopped. We have continued to engage with impacted communities and your donations are continuing to reach those in need.

We've always said disaster recovery is a marathon and not a sprint. We've made significant inroads but there is still much more to do.

Bendigo Bank, our Foundation and many of our partners are using knowledge and lived experience to guide the distribution of donations. We're committed to ensuring every single cent donated to this appeal is delivered to those in need.

Emergency support

In partnership with The Salvation Army we immediately released \$1.5 million for emergency housing payments. An additional \$3.75 million of bereavement payments was made to families who lost a loved one fighting fires, fencing aid for farmers and support for temporary accommodation for people with damaged or lost homes.

\$10 million for housing support

Further relief payments of \$25,000 are available for Victorian households who have lost homes, already \$6.9 million has been distributed through Windermere Child and Family Services. This will ensure people continue to have a roof over their heads and can replace household and personal items.

Rebuilding fences across three states

More than \$1 million has been directed to the volunteer group BlazeAid. Camps continue to be set up and once COVID-19 travel restrictions are lifted, volunteers will again come from everywhere to help rebuild fences, one property at a time.
